FURTHER UPDATES ON SCHOOL MATTERS FOR TERM 3 & 4, 2020

Enhanced Safe Management Measures (SMM) for Year-end School-based Examinations

MOE has given further guidelines to safeguard the well-being of both students and staff during the conduct of the Prelim and Year-end School-based examinations. Students who are confirmed COVID-19 cases (currently quarantined in hospital or community isolation facilities) or who are on Home Quarantine Order (HQO) / Stay Home Notice (SHN) / Leave of Absence (LOA), medical leave or are unwell with fever or flu-like symptoms should not sit for any school-based examinations. Schools may allow students who are on Approved Absence (AA) to sit for school-based examinations, but not other weighted assessments (e.g. tests).

Study Break for Sec 4/5 Students in the lead up to Year-end National Examinations

MOE has strongly encouraged schools to implement a study break in the lead up to the Year-end National Examinations. This is to minimise the risk of school-based transmission and reduce QO/ LOA numbers in the event of a confirmed case. Our school has already scheduled the following study breaks for Sec 4 & 5 students which meet the recommended minimum duration and period by MOE, taking into consideration the impact on student well-being and exam readiness:

During the study break, students are **strongly encouraged to remain at home** to reduce the risk of contracting the Covid virus from the community. Consultations with teachers could be done **remotely** if necessary. However, **high need students** who require care giving, more targeted academic, emotional support and a place for self-study may return to school with additional SMMs in place. They could also stay back in school after consultations for self-study and revision after school hours. **These high need students need to obtain prior permission from their subject teachers (for consultations) or form teachers (for self-study), who will keep the school informed.**

Student Progression and Subject Combination Offerings

Please be assured that students who were unable to take part in various Weighted Assessments will not be disadvantaged during the promotion and subject combination option exercise. The school will exercise professional judgement in determining what would be educationally meaningful for the student in terms of student progression and subject combination offerings with special considerations.

National Day Music Video – "Be the Light"

Our Choir CCA was supposed to put up a combined choir performance with 4 other secondary schools and a special school at this year's National Day Parade. Due to Covid-19, it has been reconceptualised into a MOE-Arts Education Branch produced music video featuring the song, *Be The Light* (written and sung by a few Lianhua Primary School's students). The video is intended to showcase students' creative expressions through the past months, their contributions to the community, their resilience in responding to circumstances at home and in school, and convey the messages of Hope and Resilience. Choirs from the NDP performance schools including ours were called on to sing parts of this song, with their images woven into the video. Minimum Age for Riding of e-Scooters

LTA has been putting in measures to govern the use of active mobility devices since 2018, through the Active Mobility Act. From 1 August 2020, stricter rules are put in place to enhance safety on public paths and LTA has asked schools to help highlight one of these new rules, which may be relevant to students and their families. While the riding of e-scooters has been prohibited on footpaths, they can still be used on cycling paths. From 1 Aug 2020, only those 16 years of age and above can ride an e-scooter on cycling paths. If the rider is under the age of 16, they will need to be supervised by an adult (at least 21 years old). Penalties for first offence include up to a \$1000 fine and/or 3 months jail term. Adults who intend to supervise an individual below the age of 16 to ride an e-scooter must familiarise themselves with the guidelines of a supervisor.
