School Attendance

A school is where students learn and grow. Long periods of absences will affect learning. If your child/ward is unwell, we strongly recommend that he/she consult a doctor. Documents such as medical appointment notifications and/or medical certificates (MCs) must be submitted to your child/ward's Form Teacher **immediately** upon return.

Parent letters may be accepted under certain circumstances to explain your child/ward's absence. However, no more than 10 letters will be accepted each year. Each letter should not cover more than a day of absence. If your child/ward is not well for a longer period, it is advisable to consult a doctor. Absence from school without valid reasons will be recorded as truancy in your child/ward's official student records. This will impact his/her conduct grades, selection for school representation for competitions, as well as edusave, school and national awards.

Mobile Devices Policy (Smartphones and Smartwatches)

We want to promote a safe digital learning environment that helps students self-regulate their digital device use. Learning takes place best in the classroom when distractions such as smartphones and smartwatches are removed.

Arising from the engagement and choices made by the student community on the last day of school in 2024, we have updated the school rules in the 2025 Student Handbook as follows:

- Smartphones and smartwatches are **not allowed** to be used during curriculum and CCA hours. This includes the changeover time for lessons. **Smartphones must be kept in students' personal lockers during lessons.**
- Smartphones may only be taken out of the lockers during recess, self-study periods and after the last lesson of the day.
- Smartphones and smartwatches are **not allowed to be used in all classrooms and all special rooms** at any time of the day (e.g. NFS kitchens, D&T workshops, design studios, art room, music room, computer labs, block D rooms, hall etc).
- Students are **not allowed to use their smartphones and/or smartwatches for gaming both inside and outside of the library.** Students may use their Personal Learning Devices (PLDs) and smartphones for schoolwork only.
- Students **caught gaming on their PLDs during lessons or at no-gaming zones** in the school (classrooms, special rooms, library) **will have an offence of defiance entered into their personal school record** from the second offence.
- Students who breach rules regarding the use of smartphones and/or smartwatches will have their devices confiscated until the end of the school day for the first two offences. Parents will be asked to retrieve the confiscated devices from school from the student's third offence.
- Students are not allowed to bring mobile speakers to school or play music loudly with their devices.
- Students should bear responsibility for the safekeeping of their devices.

School Attire

Student will continue to **report to school every day in half-uniform** (PE T-shirt with pants for upper secondary boys/ shorts for lower secondary boys/ skirt for girls), as we continue to strike a balance between standards of grooming and the comfort and well-being of our students.

- Students may also choose to wear their full uniform.
- Other school-sanctioned tops that can be worn include school official committee tees (e.g. games day committee, orientation committee, student leadership board tees) and Secondary 1 OAL camp tees.
- Students will change into their PE attire for PE lessons, and change out thereafter.
- Students will be allowed to wear their **CCA T-shirts on their CCA days** in place of their PE top.

Communication Channels with Parents

Home-school partnership is critical for the success of your child. To facilitate communications, we have provided email addresses of all form teachers and key personnel in [Annex A: Staff Contact List](#). Parents may also contact teachers through the general office during school hours. However, teachers may not be able to respond immediately or may only be able to respond on the next working day. We would like to emphasise that a trusting and respectful relationship between schools and parents includes respecting teachers' time and space. Hence teachers are not expected to respond to parents'/students' queries during weekends except for emergencies. Teachers are also not expected to provide their personal phone numbers to parents. We will be regularly communicating with parents via Parents Gateway.

2025 Sec 1 Cohort: Orientation Programme, CCA Open House and Parents Engagement Session

Our 2025 Sec 1 students will be inducted into school through an exciting **orientation programme**, fully led by our student leaders. They will learn about the school, the teachers and importantly, make new friends and discover more about themselves.

We will also be holding a **CCA Open House** for students on Fri, 10 Jan from 2 to 4 pm to help them find out more about the different CCAs we offer.

A **Parents Engagement Session** will be held online on Fri, 10 Jan from 4 to 5.30 pm. We will share more about understanding and supporting your child's transition to secondary school and some other important matters with you. Safe and Responsible use of Personal Learning Device (PLD)

All Sec 2 to 5 students have already been issued with a Personal Learning Device (PLD), which are used for teaching and learning. Our school's Digital and Media Literacy curriculum also equips our students with digital literacy and technological skills.

It is the students' responsibility to take good care of and use their PLDs appropriately. Your child/ward's PLD is installed with a Device Management Application (DMA) which allows the school to determine settings to control usage of the PLDs and screen time. This helps provide a safer digital learning environment for our students' learning.

Parents/guardians play an active role as partners to help your child/ward navigate the digital environment. MOE and our school will continue to share more digital parenting tips through our communication channels.



Assessment Matters

Assessments are important for teachers to provide meaningful feedback to students to close learning gaps. We have scheduled termly Weighted Assessments (WAs) for students to obtain feedback, act on them and close learning gaps. Teachers also monitor and provide feedback on students progress throughout the year through various classroom strategies and assignments.

The scheduling of WA for different subjects will be spread across the term as far as possible. It is the responsibility of each student to check and ensure they are apprised of the assessment schedule. This is part of being a self-directed learner.
